### Help is Here

I will send you the helper from the Father. The helper is the Spirit of truth who comes from the Father. When he comes he will tell

you about me. And you will tell people about me too, because you have been with me from the beginning. (John 15:26-27)

A young man applied for a job, but the potential employer said, "I'm sorry, we don't need much help." This did not deter the candidate who replied, "that's OK, I wouldn't be much help." Ha! Human resource workers will admit that good help is hard to find. When our struggles increase, we often have two problems - 1) we don't like to admit that we need help and 2) good help is hard to find. Well-meaning friends and family don't always bring us the help we need. But I have good news for all of us - help is here in the person of the Holy Spirit! We can face life's challenges with the power of the Holy Spirit.

"Help is Here" is the title of my five week sermon series, starting April 14th and ending on Pentecost Sunday, May 19th. We will be addressing how the Holy Spirit is a helper. Life's transitions can be painful. Bills pile up. Savings accounts go down. Marriages go south. Pandemics rage. Max Lucado writes, "suddenly you feel powerless to calm life's chaos. It's all too much to take on by yourself."

However, as people of faith, we can benefit from the Holy Spirit being with us. A. W. Tozer wrote, "Pentecost did not come and go - Pentecost came and stayed." Every day can be a little Pentecost as we live in the presence of the Holy Spirit. Tozer went on, "our insensibility to the presence of the Spirit is one of the greatest losses that our unbelief and preoccupation have cost us. We have made Him a tenet of our creed, we have enclosed him in a religious word, but we have known Him little in personal experience." Sadly, Tozer's indictment is right on target for most Christians. I'd like to see that oversight corrected. After all, since God is omnipresent, help is not simply on the way, help is here already.

## Gomer is Singing Again in 2023!

Welsh hymns rung out from the russet-red brick Gomer Congregational Church during their 106<sup>th</sup> Anniversary Cymanfa Ganu this past October 1<sup>st</sup>. The balmy Sunday evening found a good crowd of enthusiastic singers coming together again for an event this

church is so clearly proud of.
Gomer is a pleasant, well-kept town in northwest Ohio, ten miles NW of Lima (pronounced lime - a, not like Lima, Peru). The town was founded by three Welsh families, the Roberts, Watkins, and Nicholas, in 1833 and was laid out in 1850, to then become for decades one of the hubs of the Welsh community in America. It lies on the axis of Gomer Road and the famous old Lincoln Highway, one of the first transcontinental highways in the U.S. designed expressly for automobiles. Formally dedi-cated in 1913, it runs coast-tocoast from Times Square, New York to Lincoln Park, San Franscisco, transversing 14 states for 3,389 miles. Other states for 3,389 miles. Other than its long-standing Gymanfa Ganu, another of Gomer's claims to fame came on October 28, 1939, when Admiral Richard E. Byrd's Antarctic Snow Cruiser drove off a small bridge on the Lincoln Highway into a stream just east of Gomer. It made national news and with-

It made national news and within three days, 125,000 people came to see the crash site.

Paraphernalia of this event but primarily an array of Welshrelated items are on exhibit in the lovely white clapboard house museum directly across the street from Gomer the street from Gomer Congregational Church. (Gomer Welsh Community Museum -419/642-5405).(More about the museum in the July 2023 WNAA Huyl Newsletter)

The evening was dedicated to the loving memory of long-term church member and supporter Teresa Barnes. Martha Britt set the mood with her organ prelude of Varner's arrangement of Praise to the Lord, the Almighty. Pastor Maurice Dunn gave the Invocation followed by a special welcome sung by Martin Thomas and Tim Larimore



Gomer's Gymanfa Ganu tra-ditionally starts with the Star-Spangled Banner, and rousing four-part harmony is evident from the opening chords, which continued with their traditional opening hymn of Rachie (1). Formal introductions followed from the Church Moderator, Sue Grusenmeyer. The guest conductor was Truman Littler, the organ accompanist Martha Britt, and the two pianists,

Truman Littler came to the stage saying how very honored he was to be asked to lead this Gymanfa Ganu, his very first, after being a part of the special music presentations in 2022. Mr. Littler is the choir director at nearby Elida Middle School and recently served as Assistant Director of the Stambaugh Chorus of Youngstown, OH. Hymn Set One included Diadem (14), Milwaukee (6), Calon Lon (66), and Bryn Calfaria (3).

For many years, at this time in the evening, former long-time church member and enthusiastic church memoer and chinasiasus Welsh American Ross Thomas reveled in singing the Welsh National Anthem in both Welsh and English. His son Martin Thomas has filled this role adminishly give the pressing of admirably since the passing of Ross in late 2021 carrying on the family tradition by singing the family tradition by singing Hen Wlad Fy Nhadau. The group 4 Praising (Cathy Woodard, Kevin Reeks, Deb Imbrock, and Truman Littler) then graced us with a very moving, beautifully harmonized acapella special number, a version of "Precious Lord, Take No. Met. Hert".

Mr. Littler moved from this to Mr. Littler moved from this to lead Hymn Set Two which started off with Deemster (29) and Huddersfield, two Gomer favorites. The set was completed with Rhosymedre (4) and Penpark (26). During the Offertory, Martha Britt impressively played Perk's "Celtic Blessing" which had a great pedal part. The Memorial Hymn was Sandon (27).

A unique, long-standing tradi-

A unique, long-standing tradi-tion at Gomer is to ask partici-

pants to identify where they have come from for the event. Over the years, this has ranged from as near as Gomer and Venedocia to as far as California and Wales. After this geographic rollcall, the final set of hymns consisted of Blodwen (60). of hymns consisted of Blodwen (60), Pen Y Byrn (46), Arglwydd, Dyma Fi (96), and Crum Rhondda (40). Pastor started the closing of the events with a Benediction, followed by everyone singing Parting Hands (117) and concluded with an Organ Postlude by Martha Britt of Phillips' "Postlude on Amazon". Amazon

It should be noted that considering this was Truman Littler's first conducting of a Gymanfa Ganu, he did an exceptional job of honoring the tradition and helped foster the hwyl that was felt throughout the evening. It was evident that he enjoyed the experience as well, as at one point early on he commented about how good the part singing was, which is something he tries to teach in his youth choirs. At another point he mentioned how he appreciated the attentiveness of the singers to his directions, as this was something he could not always count on in his role

working with youth.
In an energized two-hour timeframe, we sang 19 hymns (including every verse and fre-quent repeated refrains), two anthems, hear stirring special music, and had personalized moments that all added up to an enriching experience. Diolch enriching experience. Diolch yn fawr to Mr. Littler and to all those many contributors from the Gomer Congregational Church and community who helped make this such a fine night of singing and worship.

### Blessed are you

The Beatitudes receive little attention, lamented novelist Kurt Vonnegut. "But, often with tears in their eyes, [Christians] demand that the Ten Commandments be posted in public buildings. And, of course, that's Moses, not Jesus. I haven't heard [anyone] demand that the Sermon on the Mount, the Beatitudes, be posted anywhere." Jesus' Beatitudes have much to teach about selflessness, mourning, peacemaking and more. Jim Berger, author of Being Sermon on the Mount Christians, explains that those teachings were once "viewed as a mandate for the faithful." Post-Reformation, they became less law-like and more of a "liberating directive." Berger writes, "For Jesus, being and doing are inseparable. The Sermon is at once theory and praxis. It is not enough to read it or hear it. Jesus intends it to be how we live.
